Throughout evening	Welcome, chat to, assist guests, help serve, eat with guests, clear away.	7-9.30pm
Night shift	Meet guests, keep premises secure, sleep over	9pm-7am
Breakfast	Prepare light breakfast, help to clear hall	6.30-8.30am
